



Day by Day Itinerary

Friday, October 7 – CHICAGO / EN ROUTE (I)

We depart Chicago's O'Hare International Airport this afternoon by scheduled service of Lufthansa German Airlines on the overnight transatlantic flight to Frankfurt, Germany.

Saturday, October 8 – FRANKFURT / PRAGUE (I,L)

As the sun begins to rise on the German heartland we arrive in Frankfurt and change planes for the connecting flight to Prague, Czech Republic, where we'll meet our Tour Guide who will introduce us to the "Golden City of the Hundred Spires" and the surrounding countryside. Prague is one of the world's most impressive capital cities, full of thrilling history and glorious architecture. And, as we'll soon find out, our hotel is located on the famous Wenceslas Square pedestrian area, an amazing location offering a little something for everyone in our group. Within easy walking distance of our hotel, you'll find a number of theaters, museums, and historical monuments.

Sunday, October 9 – PRAGUE (B,L)

This morning we'll receive an introduction to Prague, one of the most beautiful and interesting of all European capitals. We'll see the Municipal House, Prague's most prominent Art Nouveau building, and the National Museum, before traveling across the Vltava River to make a stop at the magnificent Charles Bridge. Prague's most familiar landmark is the pedestrian bridge offering locals and visitors alike a virtual outdoor museum of no less than 30 religious statues. Our tour will end in the Old Town Square where we'll visit the Church of Our Lady before Týn and view the superbly preserved medieval astronomical clock and its moving figures of the apostles, and the magnificent houses that surround the square. Afterward, we'll enjoy a hearty Czech lunch at the Restaurant U Fleku, without a doubt the most famous pub in Prague.

Monday, October 10 – PRAGUE (B)

Our day begins with a visit to Prague Castle. Despite periodic fires and invasions, Prague Castle has retained historic buildings and towers from every period of its long history. Located inside the castle walls we'll visit the city's most distinctive landmark, St. Vitus's Cathedral, where a guided tour will take us back through a thousand years of history. Next, we'll take in the charming artisan cottages along the Golden Lane. Named after the goldsmiths who lived here in the 17th century, and once home to well-known writers including Franz Kafka, the Golden Lane is one of the most picturesque streets in all of Prague.

Following our tour, the afternoon is free. Historic Prague's three districts include the Lesser Quarter, the Old Town, and the New Town. The Lesser Quarter is located on the left bank of the Vltava River at the foot of the majestic Hradcany Castle. Free of traffic and ringed with historic buildings, Prague's Old Town ranks among the finest anywhere. Pending scheduling

– an optional evening theater performance will be offered as Prague is without a doubt, one of the greatest classical music destinations of the world.

Tuesday, October 11 – PRAGUE (Brno) (B,L)

This morning we leave Prague and travel to Moravia to visit the city of Brno, the Czech Republic's second largest city which has a long and rich history. We'll begin our tour high atop Petrov Hill for a sweeping view of Brno and visit the Cathedral of St. Peter and St. Paul. An icon of the Brno skyline, this 18th-century hilltop Gothic cathedral boasts an impressive Gothic exterior and richly decorated Baroque interior. Afterward, we'll explore the Old Town by visiting historic Zelný trh square, the oldest part of the city, popular for its markets, cafes, restaurants, and boutique shops and galleries. Next, we'll discover the labyrinth underneath Zelný trh square. We'll learn how food, beer and wine were once stored here, how it was used as a hideout during wars, and see a collection of archaeological findings. Our time in Brno will end following a visit to Špilberk Castle. This leading royal castle and seat of the Moravian margraves, gradually transformed into a monumental Baroque fortress, the toughest prison of the Austrian monarchy and later a military barracks. Today it is home to the Brno City Museum.

Wednesday, October 12 – PRAGUE

(Ruckl glassworks & Karlstejn Castle) (B,L)

Today we leave Prague and travel to the town of Nížbor where we'll visit Ruckl glassworks, one of the oldest and most traditional Czech glassworks. During our guided tour, we'll have an opportunity to see the traditional techniques of glass production where each step of the crystal production is explained and presented, as well as the art of hand blowing, the craftsmanship of the cutters, and have time for shopping. Afterward, we'll set our sights on Karlstejn Castle, one of the most impressive High Gothic castles in the Czech Republic. The castle complex consists of three buildings: the Imperial Palace, the Great Tower and a smaller second tower, unusual for Central European castles. Today this storybook castle is fully restored and a trip to this wonderful village will take us back six centuries in time to a day when Prague lay at the center of the Holy Roman Empire.



Thursday, October 13 – PRAGUE (Cesky Krumlov) (B,L)

This morning we travel to Southern Bohemia and the medieval town of Cesky Krumlov. This picturesque town is found in a deep, meandering valley along the upper Vltava River, and its architecture has been preserved through the ages thanks to the area's peaceful history. Our tour will include a visit to the Castle and Chateau of Cesky Krumlov founded by the Vitkovec family in the first half of the 13th century. Unusually large for a town of Krumlov's size, the castle complex consists of 40 buildings and palaces, as well as gardens, courtyards, and a moat with resident bears. One of the highlights is the well-preserved Baroque Theater, which dates to the 1400's, not to mention the view of the Old Town below. Following our tour of the castle, we'll have an opportunity to stroll through the narrow cobblestone streets of the Old Town where we'll find an enchanted atmosphere, surrounded by more than 300 well-preserved historical buildings, centuries old townhomes, inns, shops, and cafes.



Friday, October 14 – PRAGUE

(Kutna Hora & Sedlec)

(B,RD)

Today we travel east of Prague to Kunta Hora. The town originated as a small mining community in the second half of the 13th century when rich deposits of silver were found. Upon discovery, the king took over the licensing of the mines and Kunta Hora later became the second most important town in Bohemia. We'll enjoy a walking tour of the medieval town and a visit to the Italian Court, Kunta Hora's former Royal Mint that once produced the Prague groschen. We'll also see a wonderful example of Bohemian Gothic when we visit the Church of St. Barbara with its three massive and tent-shaped spires rising above a forest of flying buttresses. On our return to Prague, we'll visit the ghoulish, but fascinating, 12th century Gothic Ossuary Chapel at Sedlec. The site holds

40,000 sets of bones arranged in the shape of gigantic bells and cherubs. However, the main draw is a chandelier made of all the bones of the human body.

Tonight, we'll enjoy an unforgettable experience of a Czech Folklore show with dinner. A wonderful ensemble of dancers and musicians dressed in traditional clothing will entertain us, and you're more than welcome to join in and take an active part in learning the songs, dances, and games!

Saturday, October 15 – PRAGUE / CHICAGO (B,I)

This morning we travel to Prague's Václav Havel Airport in preparation for our return journey home. No better time to reflect on memories of our *Prague and Beyond* vacation to last a lifetime and new friendships made along the way!
