Tailgating Map and Parking

Tailgating Rules

- Lots open five hours before kickoff.
- No glass bottles, kegs or party balls are allowed.
- Trash and used charcoal must be disposed of in designated cans located in each parking area.
- No fryers or fire pits are allowed.
- NIU is a smoke-free campus and smoking is prohibited on all campus property, including in Huskie Stadium and in all tailgating areas.
- All lots close one hour after the game. Vehicles may not be left in the lots overnight.

NO PARKING IN ANY GRASS LOTS (EAST, WEST, STEVENSON):

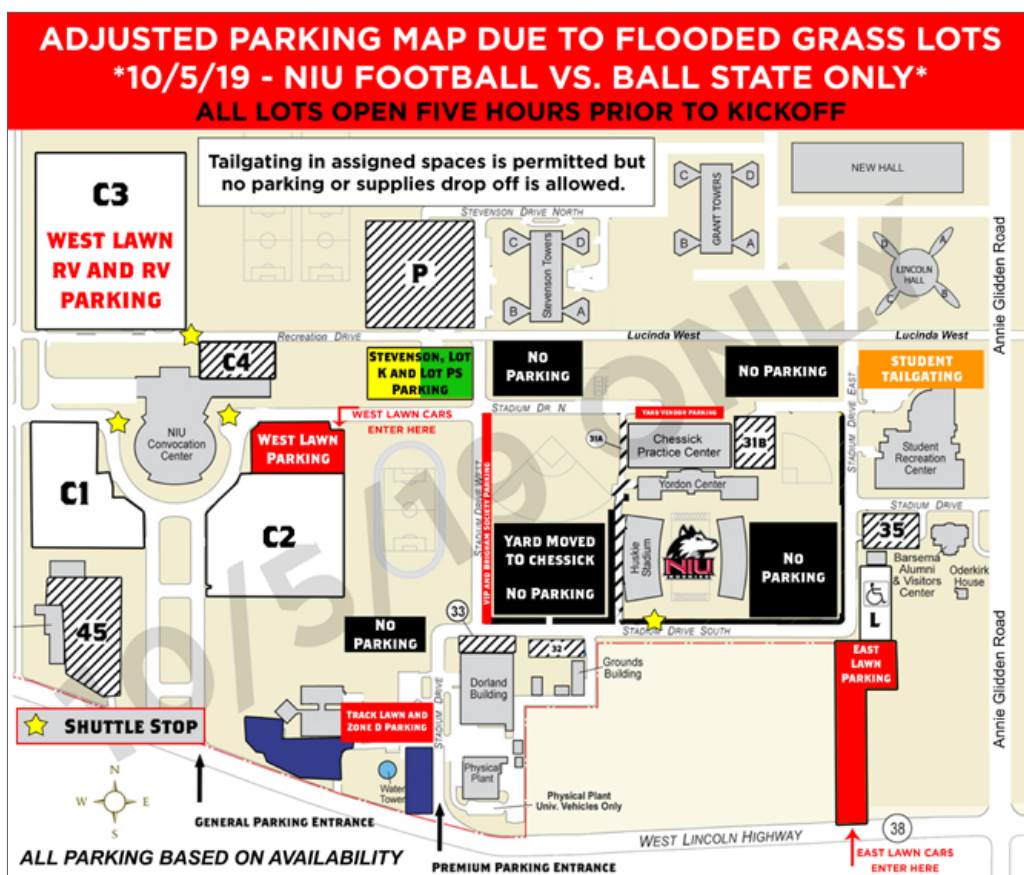

MOVING THE YARD INSIDE?

Stage, video board, flooring—blocked off—four hospitality spaces.

PARKING REDIRECTS:

- East Lawn to K
- K/PS must park in PS
- Stevenson to PS
- Track to Water Tower
- RV to C3
- West Lawn to North C2 (in front of soccer, nearest Convocation Center)
- VIPs and Brigham to Stadium Drive West.



PAY PUBLIC Parking: Convocation Center Lots open five hours prior to kickoff for tailgating. Parking charge is \$15.

ACCESSIBLE PARKING: Available in Lot L on the East side of Huskie Stadium. The fee for a car/van with a valid hangtag is \$15. An accessible van is available to shuttle guests to the East and West Entrances of Huskie Stadium.

RV, BUS AND MOTOR HOME PARKING: Available in Lot C3 on the north side of the Convocation Center for \$30 per vehicle. All lots close one hour after the game ends. Cars may not be left in the lots or on the streets overnight. Those cars left overnight assume the risk of being towed.

PARKING SHUTTLES

GENERAL SHUTTLE: Route begins three hours prior to kickoff on Saturdays and 90 minutes prior to kickoff for November weekday night games. Shuttle stops are located at Entrances 2 and 5 at the Convocation Center and the Southwest corner of Huskie Stadium on Stadium Drive South.

ACCESSIBLE SHUTTLE: Route begins 2 hours prior to kickoff. A wheelchair accessible van is available to shuttle guests to the East and West entrances of Huskie Stadium to and from Lot L.



Hearty Tailgate Chili

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1 pound ground beef chuck
- 8 ounces chorizo
- 8 ounces sirloin steak, cubed, or beef stew meat
- 4-6 slices of bacon, cut into half inch pieces
- 1 large yellow onion, chopped
- 3 cloves of garlic, minced
- 1 jalapeño, seeds removed, diced
- 2 tablespoons chili powder
- 1 tablespoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- kosher salt and fresh ground pepper, to taste
- 1 can (28 ounces) crushed tomatoes
- 1 can (28 ounces) diced tomatoes
- 1 can (15 ounces) red kidney beans, drained
- 1 can (15 ounces) black beans, drained
- 1 can (12 ounces) full-flavored beer, such as Sam Adams Boston Lager, room-temperature
- Topping ideas: sour cream, grated cheddar cheese, pickled jalapeños, chopped cilantro, diced tomatoes, sliced green onions, tortilla chips, sliced avocado and hot sauce.

PREPARATION:

1. In a large pot or Dutch oven, heat the oil over medium high heat. Add the ground beef, chorizo and cubed steak. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Brown for about 5 minutes or until just cooked through. Transfer to a plate.
2. Pour off any remaining fat and add the bacon. Cook 5-6 minutes. Transfer to the plate with the other meat.
3. Leave the bacon fat in the pot and add the onions and jalapeño. Stir over medium heat until soft, about 8 minutes. Add the garlic and stir until very fragrant, about 45 seconds. Add the beer and scrap up any browned

bits of meat from the bottom of the pan with a spatula. Return the meat to the pot. Add both cans of tomatoes. Stir in the chili powder, cumin, garlic powder, onion powder, 1 tablespoon kosher salt and 1 1/2 teaspoon fresh ground pepper. Turn up heat to medium high and bring to a simmer, then turn the heat to low. Cook 1 hour, stirring every 10 minutes.

4. Stir in the beans and cook an additional 5 minutes. Transfer to a slow cooker and you are ready for your tailgate!

Huskie Hot Dogs

PREPARATION:

Grill your package of all-beef franks (like Nathan's or Hebrew National) over a medium-high grill until charred on all sides, about 5-7 minutes. Serve hot on a warm poppy seed bun with your choice of toppings, see suggestions below.



CHICAGO STYLE

Top with:
diced onions, yellow mustard, sliced tomatoes, relish, a pickle spear, celery salt and sport peppers.

DEKALB STYLE

Top with:
grilled onions, dijon mustard and pickled jalapeños.

HOT BUFFALO STYLE

Coat your hot dog with your favorite buffalo sauce.
Top with:
blue cheese crumbles, shredded carrots, thinly sliced celery and ranch.

#MACTION CHILI

Top with:
yellow mustard, Hearty Tailgate Chili and shredded cheese.

The Yard



THE YARD at Huskie Stadium is **THE** place to be for all Huskie fans prior to every NIU football home game this fall. Free and open to the public, The Yard is located on the West Lawn within, well, yards of the stadium entrances and is the official pregame tailgate for **all fans**.

- Inside The Yard, enjoy free live music, purchase food from one of several popular local vendors, or stop by the beer garden. Catch football action from around the country on the giant video screen while your kids check out the inflatable games in the Kid's Zone.
- Meet both current and former NIU student athletes and learn what's new at NIU and in the community. Get fired up for the game when the NIU cheerleaders, Mission, Victor E. Huskie and the Huskie Marching Band stop by. Check out the latest Huskie gear in the Huskie Books and Gear store located in the Holmes Student Center.
- NIU students are welcome in The Yard, get a group of friends and stop by for a game of bags, or purchase pregame food from one of our vendors.
- Donors to the Huskie Athletic Fund at the "Coaches" Level and above (\$1,000) also are invited to the Huskie Athletic Fund Hospitality Tent, located in The Yard, to enjoy pregame appetizers, cash bar, a visit with NIU Athletics administrators and coaches, and other special guests.
- The Yard opens three hours prior to kickoff on Saturday games and will open two and a half hours prior to kickoff on weekday games.

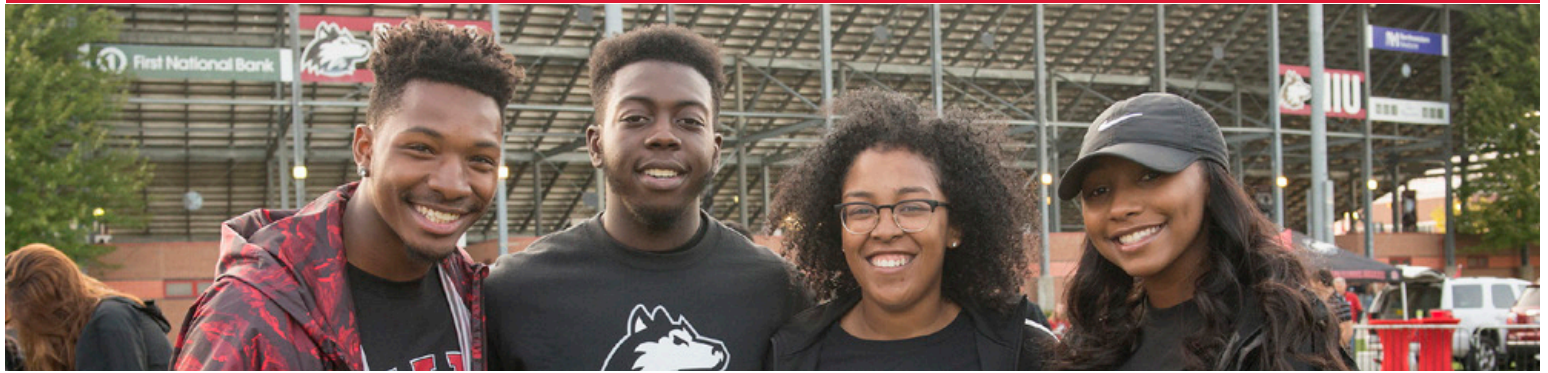

Stadium Information



Stadium Rules

- No outside food or drinks.
- No alcohol and coolers.
- No bags larger than 8.5" x 10" x 14".
- No noisemakers or horns.
- No weapons.
- No umbrellas.
- Re-entry is granted only to those with a valid game ticket and must receive a hand stamp before leaving the stadium.

Huskie Stadium Information

ANIMALS: Animals are not permitted inside Huskie Stadium, with the exception of trained service animals for fans with disabilities.

ALCOHOL POLICY: Alcoholic beverages or containers of any kind are not permitted inside Huskie Stadium.

ATM MACHINE: Located at Entrance 2 of Convocation Center and located in the parking lot on the west side of Huskie Stadium outside Gates 4, 5, & 6.

BANNERS: Fans are welcome to display banners in Huskie Stadium during games provided the sign does not contain derogatory comments, profanity, impede another fan's view of the field, cause a disturbance among other fans, or cover any stadium signage. Flags and banners on poles or sticks are prohibited. NIU Game Operations Management reserves the right to remove any sign or banner from Huskie Stadium.

CAMERAS: Cameras are allowed inside Huskie Stadium.

GUESTS WITH DISABILITIES: Seating for guests with disabilities is located between the 40-yard lines in the East Grandstand. Three bleacher seats are available for those wishing to accompany the disabled guest. This area can be accessed through the marked entrances on the concourse.

FIRST AID: Basic first aid is provided on the east side at Gate 31 and opens five hours prior to kickoff. West side first aid is located inside the stadium athletic training room and opens five hours prior to kickoff. NIU does not provide physicians for spectators at intercollegiate athletic events.

GATE OPENINGS: Gates are opened 90 minutes before kickoff.

GUEST SERVICES: The Guest Services kiosk is located just outside the grandstand on the West side of Huskie Stadium, across from the Ticket Office.

LOST AND FOUND: Articles found should be turned into the Guest Services kiosk. Fans can claim their lost item at the kiosk. Any unclaimed items will be turned over to NIU Police, who can be reached at 815-753-1212.

PROGRAMS: Programs can be purchased for \$5 from vendors stationed near each of the main entrances on the east and west sides of Huskie Stadium.

RESTROOMS: Ground-level restrooms are located on both ends of the West Grandstand and are accessible through Gates 4, 5, 7, 8, 10, 13, or 14 and outside the north and south main lobbies. Additional restroom accommodations for women are located on the top level of the ramps in the West Grandstand between Gates 6 and 9 and at Gate 16. Men's restrooms are located between Gates 13 and 15 and at Gate 3. East Grandstand patrons can find restroom facilities on the east side of the concourse.

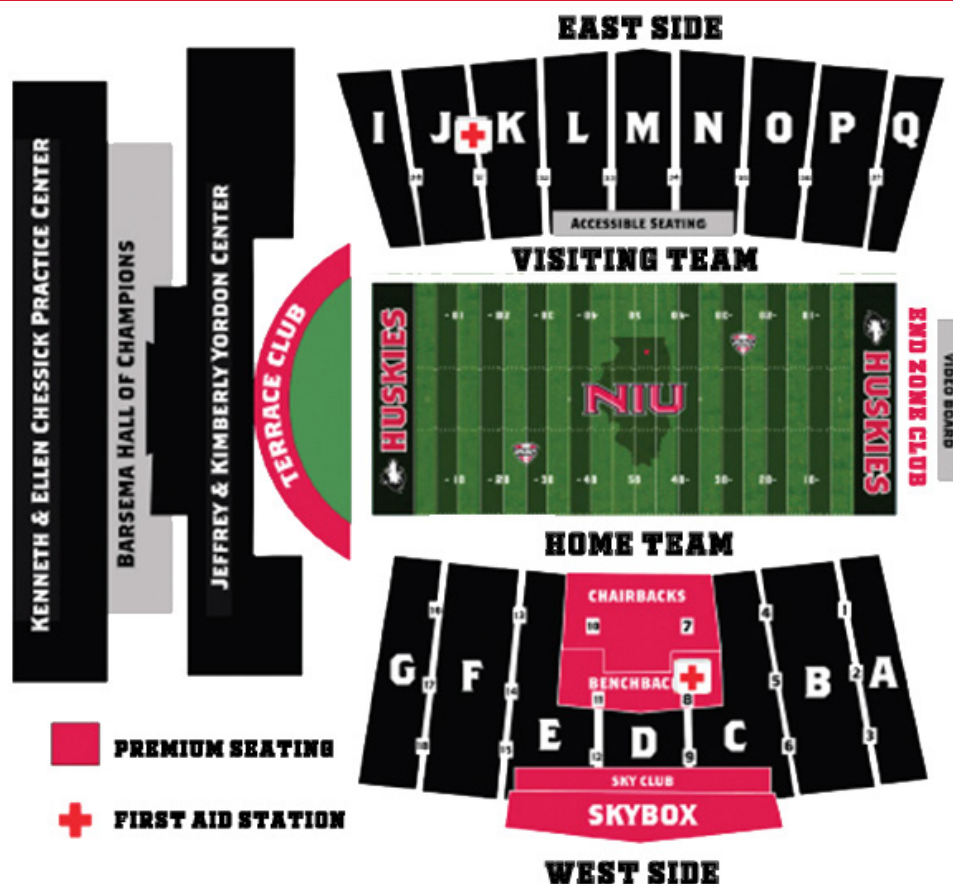
SMOKING POLICY: As of July 1, 2015, Northern Illinois University is a smoke free campus. Smoking is prohibited on all campus property both indoors and outdoors, but is allowed within your personal vehicle as long as it does not impact others. All lighted smoking materials are prohibited, including but not limited to pipes, cigars, cigarettes and electronic cigarettes.

STADIUM SEATBACKS: Unfortunately, the attachable "Huskie Seats" will not be available for rent or purchase during the 2019 football season. Huskie fans can bring their own seat cushions and seatbacks into Huskie Stadium during the 2019 season provided the seatbacks do not have armrests or pockets and do not exceed 16" across.

SUITES: The Sky Box and The Sky Club are accessible via the elevator, level 2. Guests with the proper ticket are allowed access. The Sky Club seating is outside of The Sky Box and alcohol is NOT allowed in the seating area. The Terrace Club is accessible via the Northwest Field Gate and the North End Zone stairs to The Terrace Club. Guests with the proper ticket are allowed access and must stay on the terrace—NO Yordon Center first-floor or field access is allowed. The Coaches Club is located within the West Grandstand of Huskie Stadium and is accessible via the ramps. Guests can access The Coaches Club between Gates 4, 7, 10, 13.

TELEPHONES: There are no public phones available at Huskie Stadium.

Ticketing Information



TICKET PRICES: The prices for single-game reserved seats in Huskie Stadium range from \$20-\$35 in the West Grandstand and \$15-\$30 in the East Grandstand. Season tickets, depending on the plan, cost between \$60-\$125. Admission for full-time NIU students with a valid One Card I.D. is free.

TELEPHONE: Huskie fans can order tickets 24 hours a day through Ticketmaster at 800-745-3000. For additional information on tickets, call 815-753-PACK (7225). The Huskie Athletics Ticket Office is open Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Visa, MasterCard, American Express or Discover Card orders are accepted over the phone.

MAIL: Order forms can be downloaded from the tickets section of NIUHuskies.com. Specify the game, date, number of tickets and price. Send order, payment, name, address and telephone number to: NIU Athletics Ticket Office, Convocation Center, NIU, DeKalb, IL 60115-2854.

GROUP RATE: Reserved tickets in 2019 for groups over 15 individuals are \$15 per ticket for Illinois State (8/31), Ball State (10/5) and Akron-113th Homecoming (10/26). Reserved tickets for groups over 15 individuals are \$10 per ticket for Eastern Michigan (11/19) and Western Michigan (11/26). Call 815-753-PACK (7225).

More Ticket Information

WILL CALL: Tickets can be picked up on game day at the Huskie Stadium Will Call Window (Window #7) three hours prior to the scheduled kickoff time. The Will Call Window is located in the stadium ticket booth near the base of the elevator on the west side.

CHILDREN: Tickets are required for all children three years of age or older. Children younger than three years old are free, but no seat and must sit on the lap of a parent or guardian.

GUEST TICKETS: Visiting players and coaches can pick up their tickets at Gate 16, the entrance just south of the Huskie Stadium Ticket Office.

VISITING TEAM TICKETS: Complimentary tickets will be sent to each visiting team's ticket manager who will be responsible for their distribution at the pass table located on the south end of the West Grandstand, near Gate 1. Gate opens 90 minutes prior to kickoff.

RE-ENTERING HUSKIE STADIUM: Re-entry is granted only to those with a valid game ticket and a hand stamp. Patrons must receive a hand stamp before exiting Huskie Stadium in order to regain entry to the game.

Thomas Hammock

HEAD COACH

IN JANUARY 2019, Thomas Hammock, '02, a former Huskie running back and assistant coach, returned home to NIU as the 23rd head

coach in the history of the NIU football. A native of Fort Wayne, Indiana, and one of the top football student-athletes in school history, Hammock returned to DeKalb after five seasons as an assistant coach with the Baltimore Ravens.

He is the first African-American head coach in NIU football history, but perhaps even more

importantly, he is the first alumnus to lead the Huskies as an Football Bowl Subdivision program.

"The first time I met Thomas it was clear his goal was to be the head coach of Northern Illinois University," said Sean Frazier, NIU associate vice president and director of Athletics.

Hammock, now a 16-year coaching veteran, said NIU is now and always has been his dream job.

"This has always been my dream," he said. "When I was a graduate assistant at Wisconsin (in 2003-04), I said I wanted to be the head coach at Northern Illinois University because I knew what Coach Novak did for me, and I want to do the same for others. It's an unbelievable feeling to have the opportunity to come home to a place that I love, to the school that has meant so much to me. This program has meant everything to me, and I will give it everything I have."
