Day by Day Itinerary

Wednesday, August 14 – CHICAGO / EN ROUTE (I) We depart Chicago's O'Hare International Airport this afternoon by scheduled service of Aer Lingus on the overnight transatlantic flight to Dublin, Ireland.

Thursday, August 15 – DUBLIN / DUBROVNIK (I,L,D) As the sun begins to rise on the Irish coast, we arrive in Dublin and continue by connecting flight to Dubrovnik, Croatia. On arrival, we'll meet a local representative that will take us to Cavtat, a charming Adriatic seaside town full of natural beauty and Mediterranean hospitality. After lunch and time at leisure to stroll the tree-lined harbor, we'll travel to the cruise port of Dubrovnik for embarkation aboard CroisiEurope's *MV La Belle de l'Adriatique*. As we'll soon find out, Dubrovnik is not only beautiful, but also an architectural gem that is more than 1,000 years old, and to this day remains virtually untouched by the modern world. Founded in the 7th century, Dubrovnik rose to greatness as a merchant state, independent republic and cultural crossroads.

Friday, August 16 – DUBROVNIK / CRUISING (B,L,D)

We begin our day by setting off on foot for a walking tour of Dubrovnik's Old Town. We'll start from Pile Gate, the entrance to the old walled city, and walk down Stradun to visit the 14th century Franciscan Monastery whose cloister ranks among the most inspiring sites of the city, and is also home to the oldest, still working pharmacy in all of Europe. We'll also visit the Rector's Palace which used to be the seat of the Government and the Rector in the once independent Republic of Dubrovnik. Afterward, we'll visit the Cathedral, built on the remains of the old Cathedral that was destroyed in 1667 by an earthquake. Our tour will come to an end with a view of Sponza Palace, notable for its columned courtyard and elaborate stone carvings.

From the moment we depart Dubrovnik, you know this will be a vacation to treasure forever. The Croatian coastline and its islands rank among the most intricately indented coastlines in the world. Of the 1,244 islands, islets, cliffs and reefs, only 50 are inhabited. Due to the rugged coastline and being only 30 miles wide at its widest part, the Dalmatian coast is known for its warm sea and fantastic ports of call and is best seen from the deck of a passing ship.

Saturday, August 17 – CRUISING (Mljet & Korcula)

(B,L,D)

This morning's port of call is the island of Mljet. Isolated and untouched, the pristine natural surroundings only add to the island's mysticism. The most visited part of the island is the green and unspoiled west, declared a national park in 1960. On our guided tour we'll enjoy a short boat ride across the glass-clear waters of the Big Lake, taking us to the small island of St. Mary where we'll visit the 12th century Benedictine Monastery that formerly housed a hotel. As we'll soon see, St. Mary's Monastery gives new meaning to the word 'secluded'.

This afternoon's port of call is the beautiful island of Korcula.



As the birthplace of Marco Polo, Korcula is a historical icon with many museums and cathedrals. Our guided tour will introduce us to the important cultural monuments, and we'll also learn about the way of life, old traditions and specialties of the island. Surrounded by strong 13th century walls and reinforced with towers and bastions built by the Venetians, a walking tour of the Old Town will reveal some of the finest sights such as the Civic Museum and include a visit to the Cathedral of Saint Mark as well as the Abbey Treasury.

Sunday, August 18 – CRUISING

(Sibenik & Krka Falls)

(B,L,D)

Today's port of call is Sibenik, located in the middle of the Croatian Adriatic Coast, where the Krka River flows into the Adriatic Sea. Sibenik's rich cultural and historical heritage will be evident on our guided walking tour that will include a visit to St. Jacob's Cathedral. This stunning Renaissance building, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site, has taken Croatian and international experts years to restore following it's shelling in the Croatian War of Independence fought from 1991 to 1995. Additional highlights include numerous churches, the former Count's Palace which is now the Civic Museum, and the four fortresses that 'frame' the city.

Following our tour of Sibenik we'll travel to Krka National Park, home to a carefully preserved ecosystem. The park, established in 1985, covers 67 square miles of land along the Krka River. Here we'll have the opportunity to visit an ancient mill, hike through untouched nature, view the cascading waterfalls and visit the island of Visovac. Be sure to bring your camera!

Monday, August 19 – CRUISING (Trogir & Split)(B,L,D) We begin our day on arrival in Trogir, a pleasant town set on a small island connected to the mainland and the island of Čiovo by bridges. Trogir is one of the jewels of the Dalmatian coast. We'll enjoy a guided walking tour of the Old Town, under UNESCO protection, a treasure trove for lovers of art full of Renaissance and Baroque buildings, and Romanesque churches. We'll visit the Cathedral of St. Lawrence with its west portal, a masterpiece of Radovan and the most significant example of Roman and Gothic art in Croatia. We'll also take in the Town Hall, Loggia and Clock Tower. Then it's time to explore the narrow lanes and village squares at our leisure.

This afternoon's port of call is the ancient coastal town of Split, a city with a 1700-year old tradition, and a variety of archaeological, historical and cultural monuments, among which is the well-known Palace of Diocletian, inscribed into the UNESCO World Heritage List. We'll begin our tour of the historic inner city with a visit to the Emperor Diocletian's Palace, the only imperial palace from Roman times in which residents' dwell. We'll also see the remnants of Split's Roman heritage, and its Renaissance and Gothic structures, including the Temple of Jupiter, Peristyle Square and the Cathedral of St. Domnius. Afterward, free time will be set aside to enjoy a cappuccino along the Riva, a pedestrian paradise offering a spectacular view of the sea.

Tuesday, August 20 – CRUISING (Hvar & Vis) (B,L,D) This morning's port of call is the island of Hvar. Art treasures, beaches and fields of lavender make this island one of the gems of the Adriatic. A walking tour of Hvar Town, located in picturesque natural surroundings on the south side of the island, will take us to the Pjaca, where we'll find Hvar's three most important buildings. We'll visit the Renaissance Cathedral of St. Stephen, take in the Clock Tower and Loggia constructed in 1497, and learn about the ancient Arsenal, which dates from the 16th century and housed the first public theater in the Balkans. From here we'll walk along the promenade to visit the Franciscan Monastery built in the 15th century as a retreat for sailors.

This afternoon we sail to the island of Vis. Of all the Croatian islands, Vis is the most mysterious - even to locals. The

furthest of the main central Dalmatian islands from the coast, Vis spent much of its recent history serving as a military base for the Yugoslav National Army, cut off from foreign visitors from the 1950s right up until 1989. On arrival, free time will be set aside to explore the town at our leisure, an opportunity to really see "the Mediterranean as it once was."

Wednesday, August 21 – CRUISING (Kotor) (B,L,D)A leisurely day will take us to the independent state of Montenegro and the town of Kotor, an extraordinary place full of marvelous architecture and pretty town squares. We'll enjoy a guided walking tour of the historic center, a treasure trove of monuments and cultural heritage. We'll visit the Cathedral of St. Tryphon, one of the oldest and most beautiful examples of Roman architecture along the Adriatic Sea that is home to a rich collection of artifacts. We'll also see the ancient town gates and visit the Maritime Museum of Montenegro grown from a collection founded by the "Boka Marine" Fraternity around the year 1880. We'll learn about important events and the most distinguished personalities from the rich past of the Bay of Kotor, and how the sailors established new routes of maritime trade on the Adriatic and Mediterranean seas.

Thursday, August 22 – DUBROVNIK / CHICAGO (B,I) This morning we disembark from the *MV La Belle de l'Adriatique* and transfer to Dubrovnik's Čilipi Airport in preparation for our return journey home. No better time to reflect on memories of our *Croatia and Montenegro Coastal Voyage* to last a lifetime and new friendships made along the way!
