### Day by Day Itinerary

#### Friday, April 13 - CHICAGO / EN ROUTE

We depart Chicago's O'Hare International Airport this afternoon by scheduled airline service on the overnight transatlantic flight to mainland Europe.

#### Saturday, April 14 – BUDAPEST

As the sun begins to rise on the European continent we arrive in our gateway city and change planes for the connecting flight to Budapest, Hungary. On arrival we'll meet our local Tour Guide who will introduce us to the enchanting and exotic capital city of Budapest. As we'll soon find out, Budapest's ornate turn-ofthe-century architecture, elaborate bathhouses and wide, leafy boulevards make for an intriguing and unique city experience.

#### Sunday, April 15 – BUDAPEST

Today we will enjoy an introductory tour of Budapest beginning in "Buda's" Castle District where we'll see the Royal Palace, one of the symbols of Hungary that has been the scene of battles and wars since the 13th century. We'll view the seven-hundred year-old Matthias Church, the coronation church of Hungarian Kings, and Fishermen's Bastion occupying a site along Buda's old defensive walls and a medieval square where fish was once sold. Then we'll visit Gellert Hill from where there is a beautiful view of the city. From here, we'll make our way across the Chain Bridge, the city's first permanent bridge to span the Danube, to modern day "Pest." Here we'll see the neo-Gothic Parliament, St. Stephen's Basilica, where the Holy Right Hand of the founder of Hungary, King Saint Stephen is on display, and Heroes' Square, a World Heritage Site that pays tribute to Hungary's National Identity. At the completion of our tour, we'll return to our downtown hotel where the remainder of the day is at leisure.

#### Monday, April 16 – BUDAPEST / CRUISING (B,D)

The morning hours are free to explore Budapest at your leisure. Stroll in the parks of Margaret Island, explore the hidden medieval courtyards of the castle district or visit one of many colorful cafes. This afternoon we set sail from Budapest and begin our journey. With an overall length of over 1,800 miles, the Danube River flows from its source in the Black Forest of Germany through eight countries to the Black Sea. Our home for the next seven nights is the *Scenic Jade*, a sumptuous four-deck ship that boasts a laidback elegance and lavish amenities that are paramount features of Scenic's state-of-the-art 5-star luxury.

#### Tuesday, April 17 – CRUISING (Kalocsa)

Our first port of call is Kalocsa, Hungary. Set on the left bank of the Danube River, Kalocsa is one of Hungary's oldest towns and dates back to the early 11th century. As the town evolved it became known for its paprika production and intricate handcrafted embroidery, traditions that still thrive today. This afternoon we'll experience the beauty of the Great Hungarian Plain as we visit the large ranch of a local Puszta horse farm. Here we'll enjoy an exciting performance showcasing the exceptional riding skills of the Magyar horsemen. We'll watch an exciting performance by the famous csikós, dressed in flowing blue and black outfits, as they perform traditional moves such as laying horses, sitting horses, and carriage driving.

#### Wednesday, April 18 – CRUISING (Osijek, Croatia) (B,L,D) Today's port of call is Osijek, located in Croatia's Slavonia region. With the Freechoice shore excursion program you can select your

With the Freechoice shore excursion program you can select your daily activities and sightseeing according to Relaxed, Moderate and Active adventures. Enjoy a tour of Osijek's romantic Old Town featuring the Cathedral of St. Peter and St. Paul, the tallest church in Croatia that contains stunning stained glass windows; as well as the beautiful Croatian National Theatre. You'll also visit Tvrda, the self-contained 18th-century Hapsburg defensive fortress. For those in search of Moderate or Active adventures, you can try your hand at fishing in a local village stream or opt for a blissful guided bike ride through Osijek's countryside. As a *Scenic Jade* guest, we'll also be invited into the home of a local family for a traditional home-cooked meal and the chance to discover what everyday life is really like in Croatia.

Thursday, April 19 – CRUISING (Belgrade, Serbia) (B,L,D) Our port of call for the day is Belgrade, the former capital of Yugoslavia and current capital of Serbia. Known as the White City, Belgrade's architecture tells its history, with ornate buildings dating back more than 400 years standing alongside purposeful constructions from the communist period. Enjoy a guided city tour where we'll see St. Sava's Church, the largest working Orthodox church in the world, and the Museum of Yugoslav History, the centerpiece of which is the House of Flowers, the former president Josip Broz Tito's tomb. You'll also visit the impressive Kalemegdan Fortress overlooking the confluence of the Danube and Sava rivers, once one of the most fought over strategic points in South Eastern Europe. Alternatively, you can choose from a guided bicycle ride along the Danube River, taste your way around the local market through the cruise lines Shop with a Chef offering, or for some true insight into local life, take a walk through the city with a local.

#### Friday, April 20 – CRUISING (Iron Gates) (B,L,D) A day at leisure will allow us to sit back and admire the scenery as we cruise the spectacular Iron Gates, a narrow gorge that the Danube River has carved out between the Carpathian and Balkan Mountains. Not only is it a spectacular setting for a cruise, it's also the natural border between Serbia and Romania. This 83-mile-long gorge is highlighted by a breathtaking backdrop of mountains and forests.

#### Saturday, April 21 – CRUISING

#### (Svistov & Russe, Bulgaria)

Today you can discover the Byzantine gem of Veliko Tarnovo and the World Heritage-listed village of Arbanassi, or stay on board as we cruise towards the town of Russe, where you'll be treated to an afternoon guided city tour. Svistov is the jumping off point for a visit to the picturesque hillside setting of Veliko Tarnovo, one of Bulgaria's most beautiful cities. Here you'll visit the hilltop fortress of Tsarevets that served as the capital of the Second Bulgarian Kingdom from 1185 to 1393, when it fell to the Ottomans. You'll also find the city is famous for its

impressive churches and monasteries. Of particular note, you'll see the Church of the Forty Martyrs, which at one time was the final resting place of St. Sava, and later the proclamation site for Bulgaria's independence on September 22, 1908. Afterward, you'll travel to the village of Arbanassi for a visit of the Nativity Church with its intricate floor-to-ceiling murals and icons. For travelers who opted for a leisurely morning on board ship, this afternoon you'll enjoy a guided sightseeing tour of Russe. Because of its stunning Neo-Baroque and Neo-Rococo architecture, the city has earned the designation as a "Little Vienna."

**Sunday, April 22 – CRUISING (Silistra, Bulgaria)** (B,L,D) Our last full day on board the *Scenic Jade* begins in the city of Silistra, located on the southern bank of the lower Danube River at the country's border with Romania. From here you'll have an opportunity to travel to the tranquil coastal resort of Varna, the "Pearl of the Bulgarian Black Sea Riviera." Varna is home to the Archeological Museum which houses gold treasures from the Chalcolithic Period, widely believed to be the oldest gold ever discovered. You'll also see the Orthodox Cathedral built shortly after the Liberation of the Ottoman rule, as well as the Roman Baths, built in the 2nd century AD, which are the fourth-largest preserved Roman Baths in all of Europe. Alternatively, you can choose to tour Silistra Fort, or visit a local village and a primary school, to learn about daily life in Bulgaria.

Monday, April 23 – CRUISING / BUCHAREST (B,L,HD) This morning our river cruise comes to an end in Giurgiu as we disembark from the *Scenic Jade* and travel to Bucharest, where regeneration has breathed new life into the Romanian capital's Old Town. This afternoon we'll enjoy a tour of Bucharest's wide boulevards that have a distinctly French feel, while taking in the period buildings and historical sites with your choice to visit either Europe's largest building, the enormous Palace of the Parliament constructed by former dictator Nicolae Ceausescu, or the Village Open Air Museum where you'll discover ethnography exhibits depicting Romanian heritage and culture.

#### **Tuesday, April 24 – BUCHAREST / CHICAGO** (B,I) Early this morning we travel to Bucharest's Băneasa-Aurel Vlaicu International Airport in preparation for the return journey home. No better time to reflect on memories of our Eastern European River Cruise to last a lifetime and new friendships made along the way!
