Friday, July 10 - CHICAGO / EN ROUTE

This evening we depart Chicago's O'Hare International Airport by scheduled service of Scandinavian Airlines on the overnight transatlantic flight to Copenhagen, Denmark.

Saturday, July 11 – COPENHAGEN

Early this afternoon we arrive in Copenhagen, where we'll meet our local Tour Guide who will introduce us to the Danish capital. As we'll soon find out, Copenhagen is a gracious and beautiful city whose main attractions include three royal palaces - Rosenborg, Amalienborg and Christiansborg, as well as numerous museums, churches and monuments all found within its medieval streets, charming canals, and spacious squares and gardens.

Sunday, July 12 – COPENHAGEN

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A morning sightseeing tour of Copenhagen will begin at the Radhuspladsen, the city's main square that is home to Copenhagen's red brick City Hall and from where the famous pedestrian street Stroget begins. We'll pass by Tivoli Gardens, part amusement park, part cultural venue and part wonderland, before taking in the Ny Carlsberg Glyptotek, a world-class museum that boasts a wealth of Danish paintings and sculptures from the Golden Age. Next, we'll see the National Museum, Christiansborg Palace, which houses the Danish Parliament, and the Borsen, Copenhagen's Old Stock Exchange. Along the way, we'll also see the beautiful cobblestoned Kongens Nytory surrounded by fabulous buildings including the Royal Danish Theatre, and neighboring Nyhavn, home to colorful houses, stylish yachts and cozy restaurants. Then we'll stop to view the Little Mermaid statue, Denmark's best known monument, inspired by Hans Christian Andersen's fairytale, and the impressive Gefion Fountain before ending with a view of Amalienborg Palace, the official residence of the Danish Royal Family. The afternoon is free to explore Copenhagen.

Monday, July 13 – COPENHAGEN / CRUISING (North Zealand)

Today we explore North Zealand, a region filled with rural villages, forested estates and stately castles. In the town of Hillerod we'll stop to visit Frederiksborg Castle, surrounded by the beautiful Frederiksborg Palace Garden. We'll also see nearby Fredensborg Palace at Lake Esrum which enjoys a special status among Danish palaces as it is the royal couple's most used residence. Then we're headed to Helsingor to visit Kronborg Castle, known all over the world from Shakespeare's Hamlet. The cannon-surrounded fortress on the Danish coast merges with the luxurious Renaissance castle without equal in northern Europe. On our return to Copenhagen, we'll set sail aboard Norwegian Cruise Lines *Norwegian Escape*. Excitement awaits at each of our ports of call as we get set to explore the fascinating sights in the company of our traveling family on the included, private NIU Alumni Association tours.

Tuesday, July 14 – CRUISING (Rostock, Germany) (B,L,D) Our first port of call is the Hanseatic city of Rostock. This enchanting seaport in Mecklenburg-Lower Pomerania offers stunning beaches, Hanseatic gable houses and historic gates and churches. We'll begin with a guided journey along the Baltic coast as we make our way to Rostock's Neuer Markt, from where the most important monuments can easily be reached on foot. We'll see the Baroque façade of the Rathaus, the Steintor, the best known of the city gates in the old town wall, and visit the Marienkirche, home to the famous astronomical clock built in 1472. Afterward, we'll travel to Bad Doberan to visit the medieval Gothic abbey of Doberan – an opportunity to marvel at the artistic mastership of the monks. Following our visit, we'll board the nostalgic Molli train for a scenic rail journey to Kuehlungsborn, where free time will be set aside to stroll the Baltic Sea promenade.

Wednesday, July 15 – CRUISING (At Sea) (B,L,D)

Just as each destination on our cruise is a voyage of discovery, so too is our beautiful ship The *Escape* is one of the newest and most highly-rated ships from Norwegian Cruise Line. Many of the amenities onboard the *Escape* are about creating a relaxing experience, but the ship also offers phenomenal entertainment, live music, comedy, and award-winning Broadway shows.

Thursday, July 16 – CRUISING (Tallinn, Estonia) (B,L,D) Today's port of call is Tallinn, considered the best preserved medieval city in Northern Europe, boasting Gothic spires, winding cobblestone streets and enchanting architecture. Unlike many other capital cities in Europe, Tallinn has managed to wholly preserve its structure of medieval and Hanseatic origin. Our introductory walking tour begins in the picturesque Lower Town where we'll visit the historic Town Hall Square, hear stories about how the weather-vane got its name, and which famous recipe was invented in the Town Hall Pharmacy, the oldest continuously functioning pharmacy in Europe. Then we'll learn about the city walls as we make our way to the Upper Town, known as Toompea. Here, we'll see the elaborately decorated Alexander Nevsky Cathedral, the Estonian Parliament, Dome Church, and take in a magnificent panoramic view from the Toompea Hill viewing platform. Afterward, free time will be set aside to explore Tallinn at your leisure.

Friday, July 17 – CRUISING (St. Petersburg, Russia) (B,L,D) Our port of call for the next two days is St. Petersburg. Built by Peter the Great at the beginning of the 18th century, St. Petersburg was once the capital city of the Great Russian Empire. Often referred to as the "Window to the West," St. Petersburg is considered the most graceful of all Russian cities. Our day will begin with a visit to the Hermitage, incorporating the breathtaking state rooms of the Winter Palace, undoubtedly the most famous building of imperial St. Petersburg, not only as the residence of the tsars and the backdrop for the 1905 and 1917 Revolutions, but also the home of the world's largest museum of art with a collection of West-European paintings comprising works by Leonardo da Vinci, Raphael, El Greco, Rembrandt, and many others. Following lunch, we'll enjoy a sightseeing tour of the city where we'll see such distinctive landmarks as Smolny Convent, Pushkin Theater, Kazan Cathedral, and travel along Nevsky Prospect, the city's most famous avenue. In addition, we'll visit the Peter and Paul Fortress, located on Zayachi Island. The fort was named after the apostles Peter and Paul, and its magnificent cathedral is the burial place for the Russian Emperors and their families. We'll also visit St. Isaac's Cathedral, the third-highest domed building in the world, richly decorated with mosaics, gold and minerals from all over the world.

Saturday, July 18 – CRUISING (St. Petersburg, Russia)

Today we travel to the south shore of the Gulf of Finland to visit the royal residence of Petrodvorets, the grand summer palace of Peter the Great that sits atop a hill along the shores of the Gulf. Also known as Peterhof, and inspired by the Palace of Versailles, Petrodvorets is renowned for its beautifully landscaped parks that are filled with bronze statues, fountains and cascades. We'll have an opportunity to indulge in the palace's charming French gardens, dotted with decorative ponds and a number of pavilions. In the middle of the grounds is the spectacular Grand Palace, built in Baroque and Russian styles, featuring hundreds of rooms.

Sunday, July 19 – CRUISING (Helsinki, Finland) (B,L,D) Today's port of call is Helsinki. As we'll soon find out, the sea is ever present in continental Europe's most northerly capital, aptly named the "Daughter of the Baltic." Our day will begin with an introduction to Helsinki's most cherished attractions. We'll drive by the University and see the massive red granite Parliament House and opposing Finlandia Hall, designed by the famous Finnish architect Alvar Aalto, as well as the spectacular Opera House. We'll visit the magnificent Temppeliaukio Church. Carved from solid granite bedrock, this circular "Church in the Rock" was designed in 1960 by the Soumalainen brothers and rapidly became one of the city's main attractions renowned for its ingenious engineering and architectural solutions. Nestled among the trees of Sibelius Park, we'll also take in the contemporary Sibelius Monument, commemorating the life of acclaimed Finnish Jean Sibelius. We'll also set aside time to explore the colorful Market Square and neoclassical Senate Square, where we'll find the familiar silhouette of the gleaming Helsinki Cathedral.

Monday, July 20 – CRUISING (Stockholm, Sweden) (B,L,D) Our final port of call is Stockholm, often referred to as the "Venice of the North." Our tour will start at Sergels Torg, the modern city center, and travel the streets around the Kungstradgarden that has long been the city's most popular meeting place. Around the park, we'll see the Royal Opera House and other stately



buildings including Sweden's most exclusive department store Nordiska Kompaniet. Next, we'll drive along Fjallgatan Street for a panoramic view of the city and harbor before visiting the Vasa Museum. Here we'll view the Vasa standing majestically in her custom built home for all to admire. Then we're headed to the Old Town, more commonly known as the Gamla Stan, where we'll see Stockholm's Parliament, the Royal Palace, and the 700-year-old Storkyrkan, Stockholm's Cathedral. Following our walking tour through the Old Town, free time will be set aside to explore.

Tuesday, July 21 – CRUISING (At Sea) (B,L,D)

Today is spent at sea, where a whole host of activities and facilities await. And don't forget the nightlife: multiple restaurant choices, a quiet evening in the library or movie theater, and late night entertainment in the Broadway style theater. As the evening hour approaches, stand on deck and watch as a summer evening's last measure of daylight lavishes the sky with a lustrous porcelain glow known as the "White Light."

Wednesday, July 22–COPENHAGEN/CHICAGO (B,I) Early this morning we return to the port of Copenhagen and transfer to Copenhagen's Kastrup Airport in preparation for the return journey home. No better time to celebrate the beginning of new friendships and reflect on memories of our Baltic Cruise Adventure to last a lifetime!
