FANNY RUTH PATTERSON SCHOLARSHIP

Fanny Ruth Patterson was the first Black student to graduate from NIU. She earned a bachelor's degree in education in 1915 and was known as a brave innovator and school teacher. This scholarship has been established by the Black Alumni Council to honor Fanny as a trailblazer for other Black or African American students who follow at Northern Illinois University. The scholarship is awarded to deserving students who embody the spirit of Fanny Ruth Patterson, have earned 70+ credit hours, have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 and are active in campus affairs.

The first \$10,000 raised during this campaign will be awarded to students for the 2023-24 academic year. Any funds raised above that amount will be added to the endowment for the scholarship to help the Black Alumni Council (BAC) fund the scholarship in perpetuity. Donate to this great cause here:
